Learning Intentions

Students, as history detectives, will engage in a range of activities to:








- Experience aspects of daily life in the 1800's (Newstead House) to identify similarities and differences between the past and present.
- Interpret sources of historical data (artefacts, photographs and drama).
- Justify the importance of significant historical sites and artefacts in Brisbane.
