Year 1 & 2 Program

Learning Intentions

Students, as history detectives, will engage in a range of activities to:

- Experience aspects of daily life at Newstead House to identify similarities and differences between the past and present
- Interpret sources of historical data (e.g. heritage structures, artefacts, photographs)
- Record information and data on plans and labelled maps
- Justify the importance of Newstead House as a significant historical site in Brisbane

"Inspiring Champions for the Bay"

Time	Activity
9.30-9.40	Students arrive at Newstead House. Introduction to MBEEC teachers and staff.
9.40-9.55	<i>Inquiry Question: Who lived here first and how do we know?</i> Share story of Newstead House.
9.55-10.30	Map interpretation activity to begin to understand changes in the landscape over time. <i>Inquiry Question: How has our community changed? What features have been lost and what features have been retained?</i>
10.30-11.00	Morning Tea and toilet break
11.00-11.45	Students work in two groups to participate in the following rotation activities: GROUP 1: Kate's Garden – Students become aware of the changing role of plants by engaging their senses in the Newstead House gardens. GROUP 2: Mrs Fletcher's Kitchen and Washday Wonders – Students explore a range of kitchen tools from colonial times. Through authentic hands-on historical washing techniques, experience using old equipment to understand how changes in technology have made daily life easier over time.
11.45-12.30	Students work in two groups to participate in the following rotation activities. GROUP 2: Kate's Garden GROUP 1: Mrs Fletcher's Kitchen and Washday Wonders
12.30-1.00	Lunch and toilet break
1.00-1.30	Continue story of Newstead House. Students work in two groups to participate in the following rotation activities: GROUP 1: Games on the Green and Manners- Students participate in a range of colonial outdoor games and practice "manners" with Kate Leslie GROUP 2: House Exploration- Students explore Newstead House to discover similarities and differences to their own house
1.30-2.00	Students work in two groups to participate in the following rotation activities: GROUP 2: Games on the Green and Manners- GROUP 1: House Exploration Reflection and Questioning activities
2.15	Board bus and return to school



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Students and adults will need:

- Covered footwear, suitable for walking
- Sun-safe clothing and hat
- Sunscreen and insect repellent already applied
- Water bottle, morning tea and lunch
- Rain jacket, if showers predicted

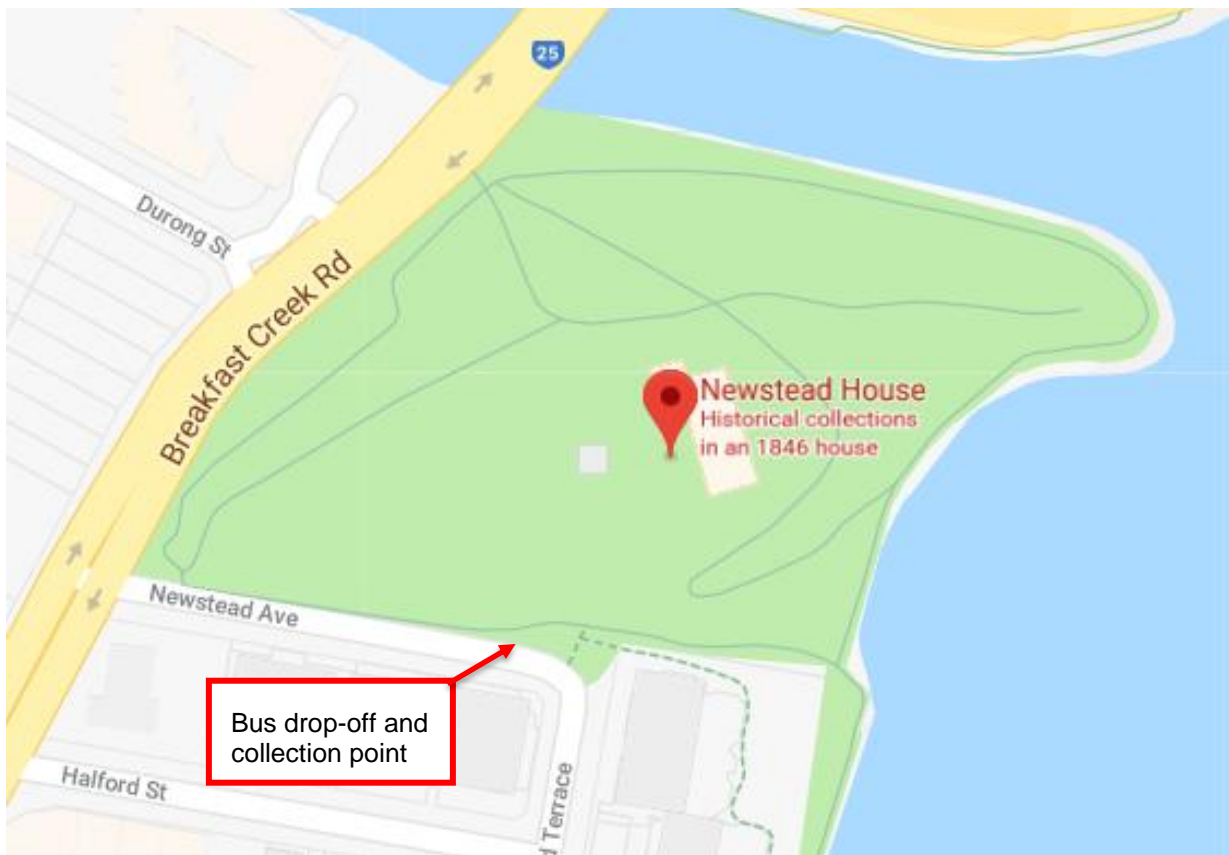
Litter-free Lunch
