Learning Intentions

As history detectives, students will:

- Recite and translate local Indigenous words for places and artefacts
- Sequence Indigenous and European events in history using a variety of sources
- Compare and contrast old and new technology
- Justify historical and geographical significance of Stradbroke Island

"Inspiring Champions for the Bay"

Time	Activity
8.30-8.45	Arrive Toondah Harbour (corner Middle St and Emmett Drive, Cleveland) Welcome and Introduction. Board Stradbroke Flyer Water Taxi for transport to Stradbroke Island. On board, students participate in a mapping exercise.
9.20-9.40	Arrive One Mile, Dunwich: Group A – Toilet break. Group B - Exploration of the "Emigrant" graves and their stories (Dunwich cemetery).
9.40-10.00	Swap Group A and Group B.
10.00-10.20	Walk to Polka Point along the beach. Morning Tea.
10.20-11.30	Indigenous Presentation – learn about some of the traditions, culture and way of life of the Aboriginal people of North Stradbroke Island. Explore the Polka Point midden as an important source of information. Walk to Museum.
11.45-12.15	Lunch and toilet break
12.15-1.05	Exploration of the history of Dunwich, and the changing technology over time through an independent exploration of the Dunwich museum. Share stories and reflect on the importance of story and history in our lives today.
1.05-1.20	Walk back to One Mile Jetty. Board Stradbroke Flyer Water Taxi.
1.55	Arrive Cleveland. Farewell History Detectives. Board bus to return to school.

Students and adults will need:

- Covered footwear, suitable for walking
- Sun-safe clothing and hat
- Sunscreen and insect repellent already applied
- Water bottle, morning tea and lunch
- Rain jacket, if showers predicted
- Please contain everything in a small back-pack

Litter-free Lunch

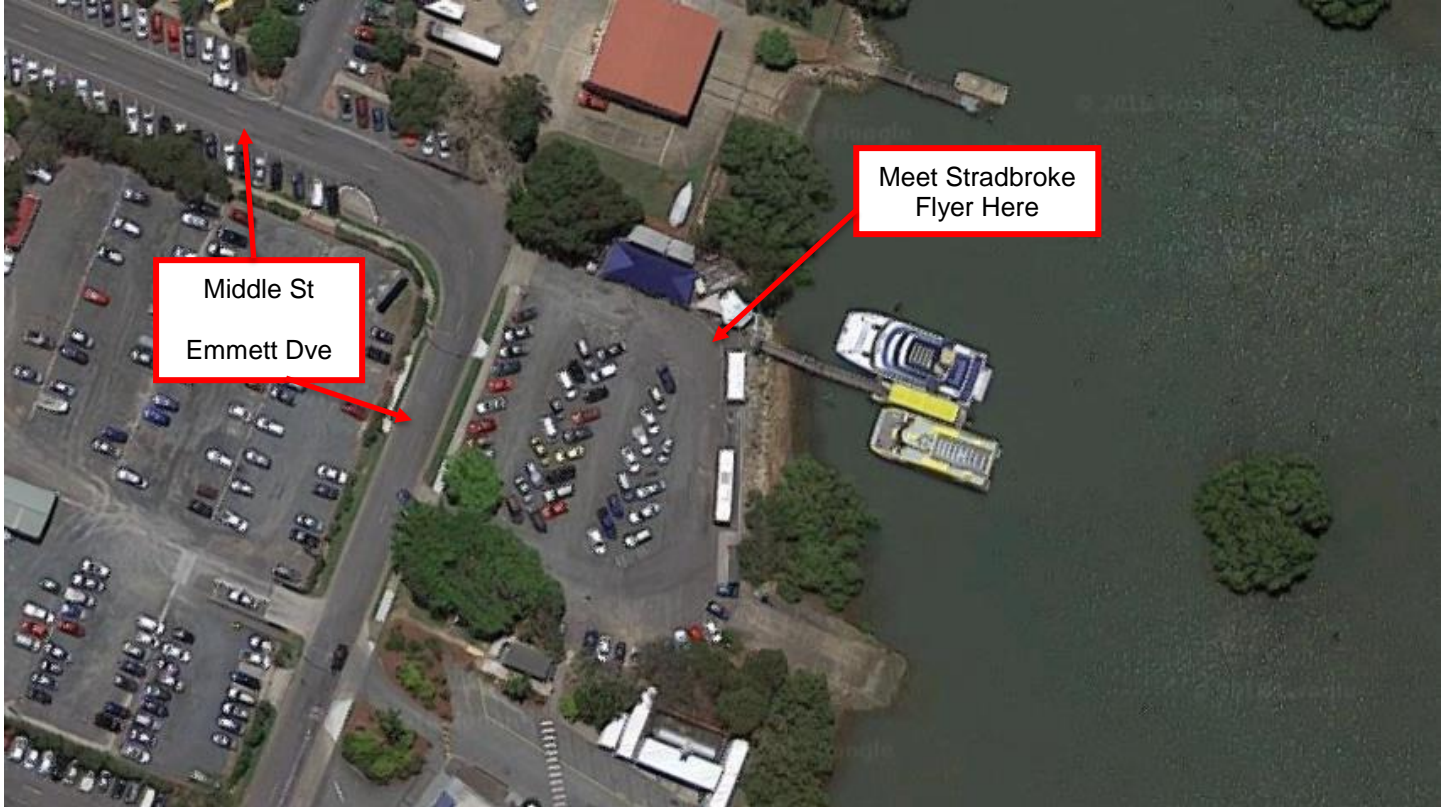
We encourage students and staff to pack a litter-free lunch. Everything in it can be re-used, composted or recycled. Drinks are brought in refillable bottles.
